The California Statewide Survey was conducted by IVR and Online Mobile Interviews from August 29 - September 01 among a random sample of 600 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.0 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Are you 18 years of age and registered to vote in the state of California?

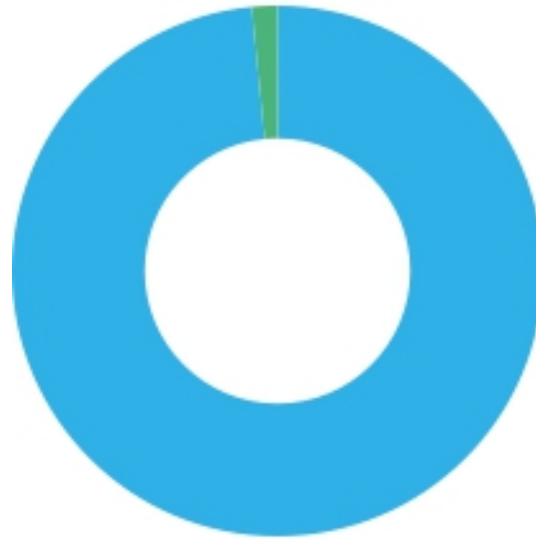

How likely are you to vote in the November 3rd General Election in California? Would you say you are extremely likely, somewhat likely, or not very likely?

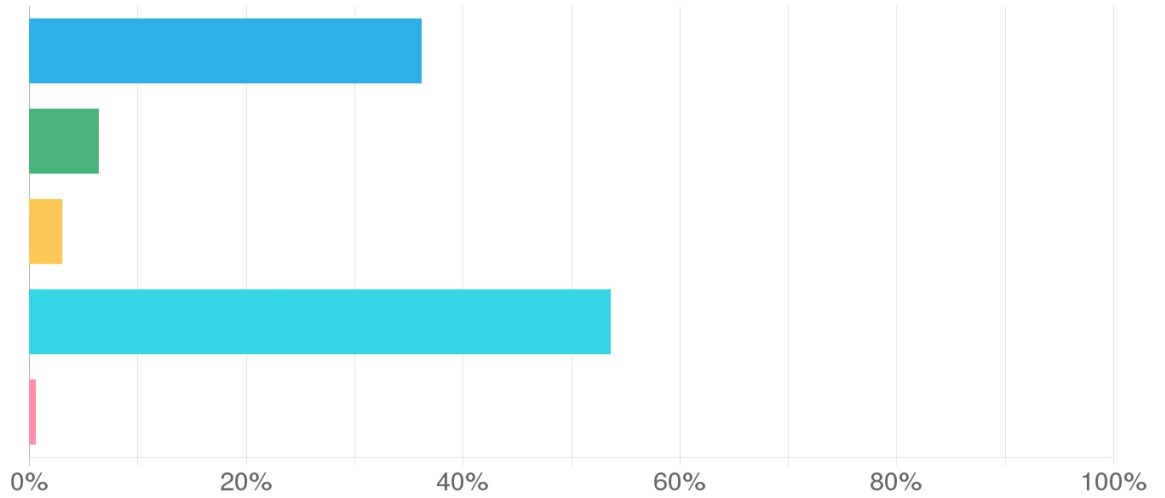

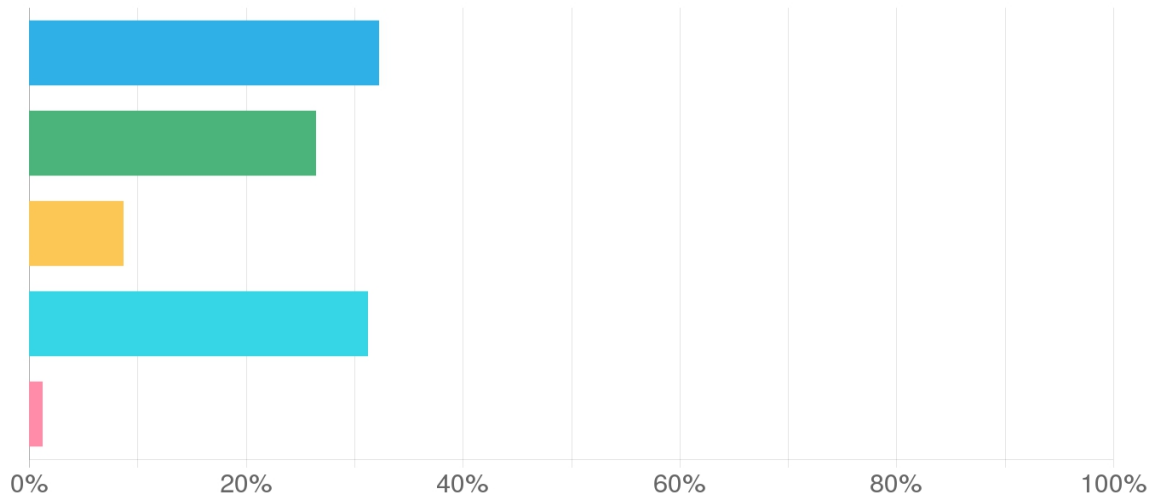

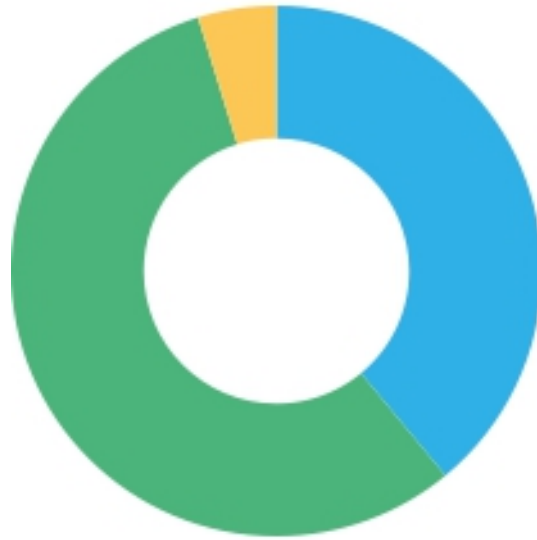

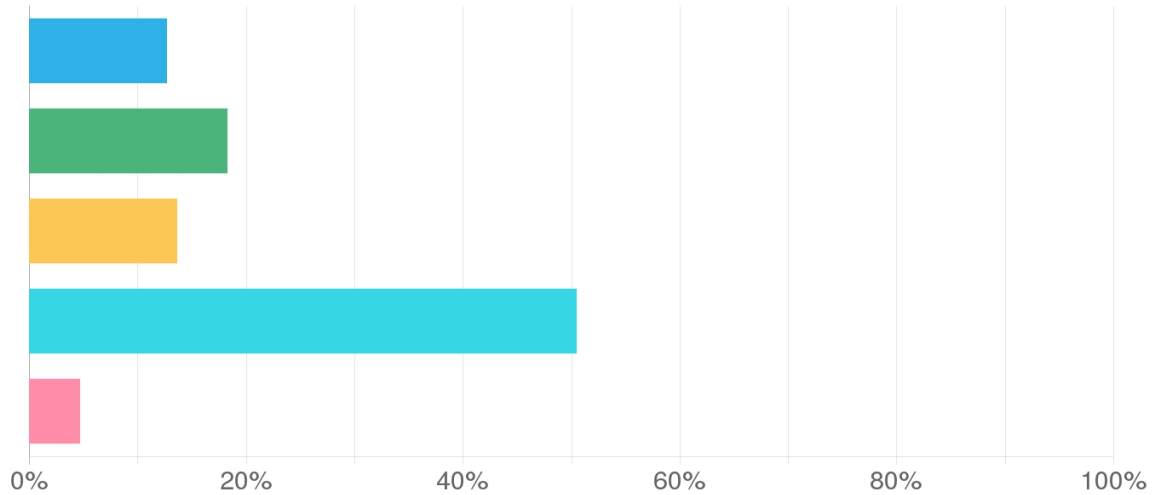

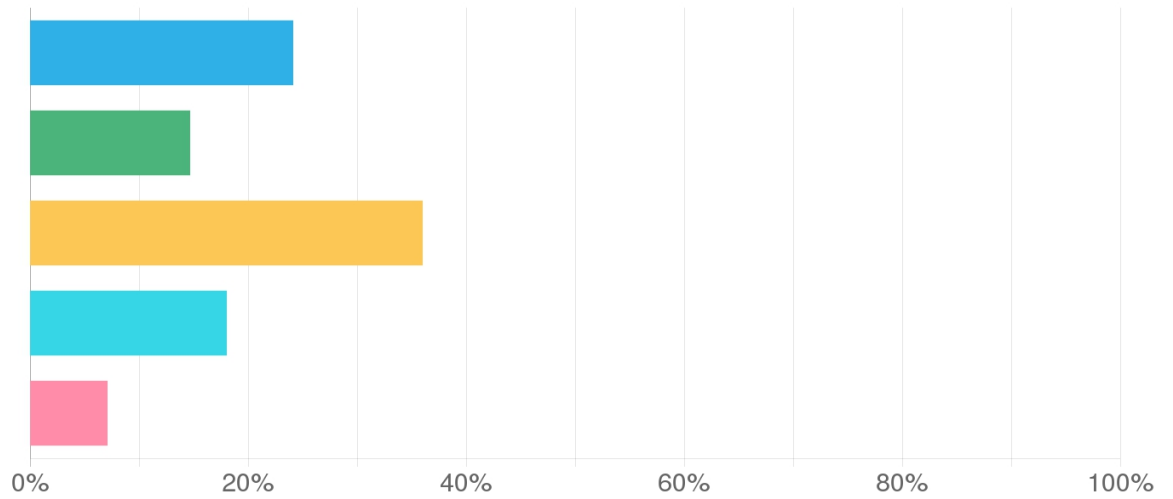

Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Someone who was born male but identifies as a woman should be allowed to use female changing rooms where women and girls are changing and/or showering.

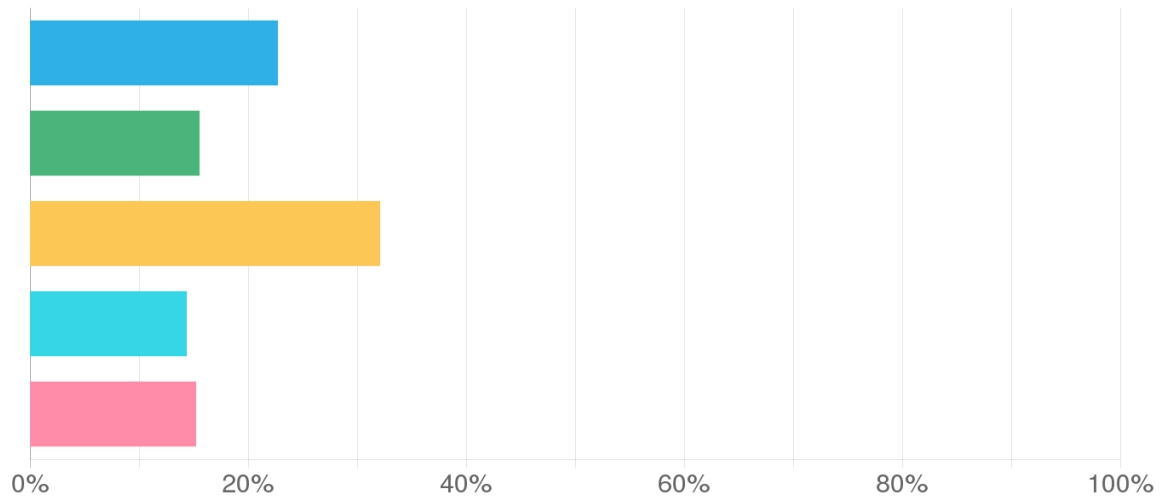

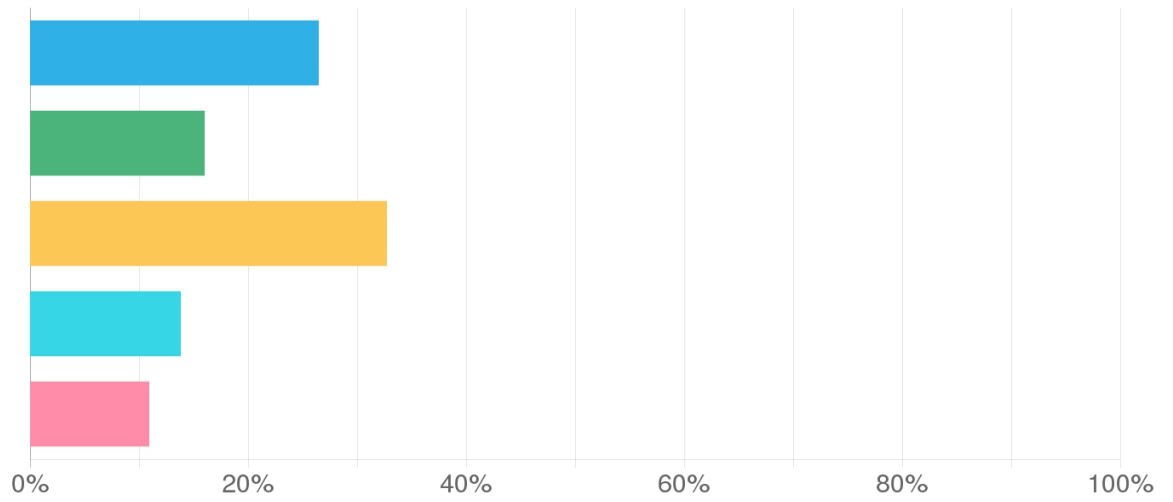

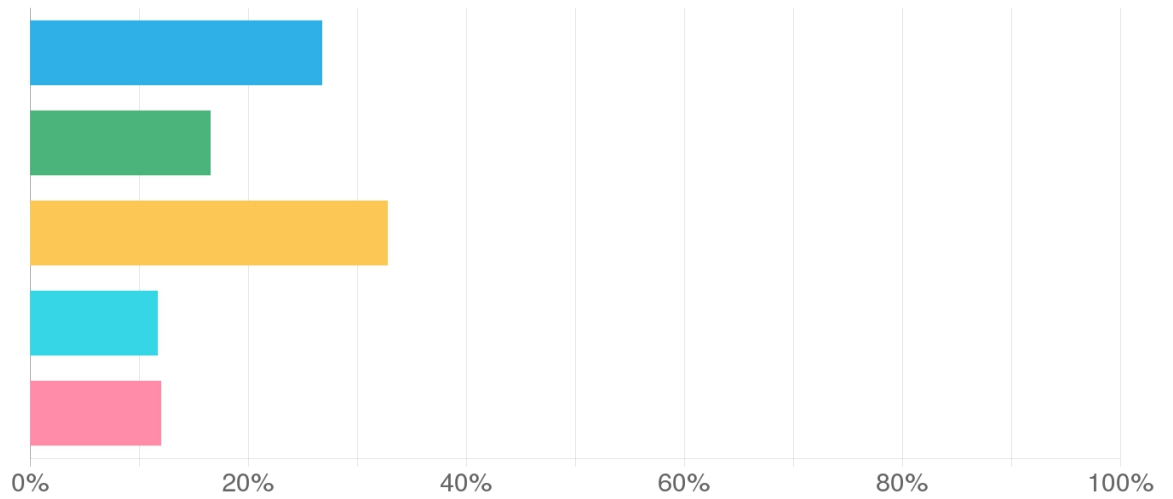

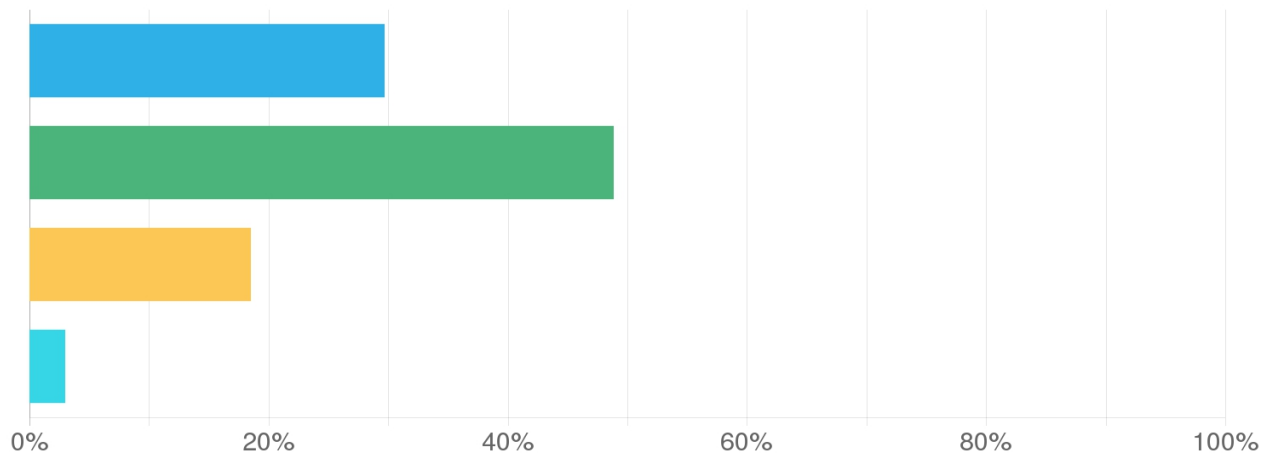

Are you a registered Republican, Democrat or Independent?

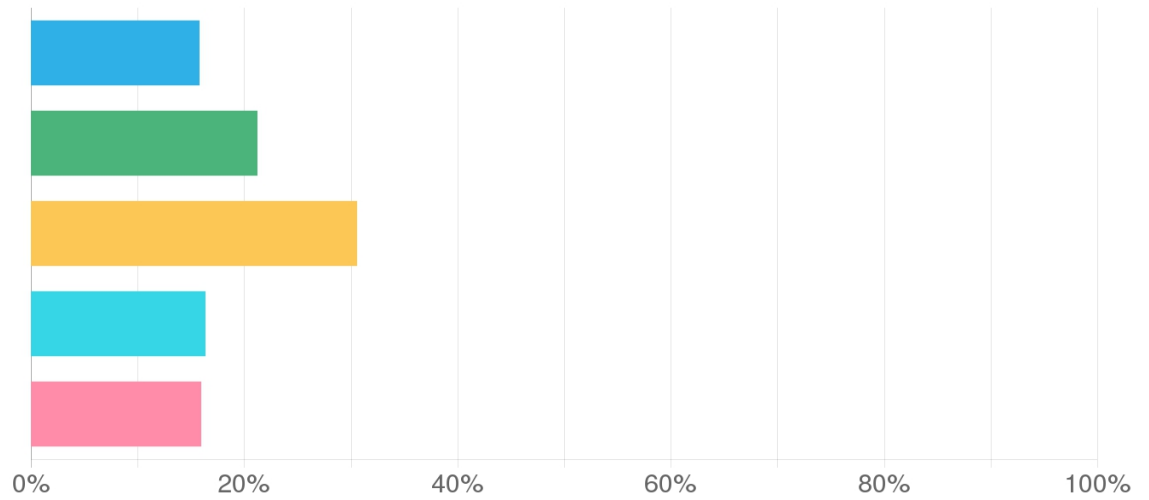

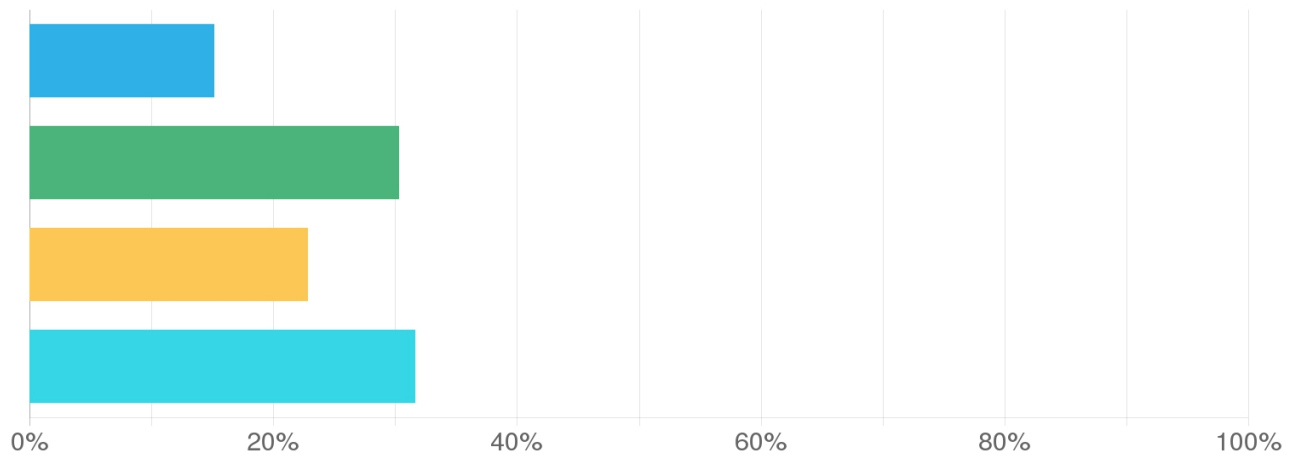

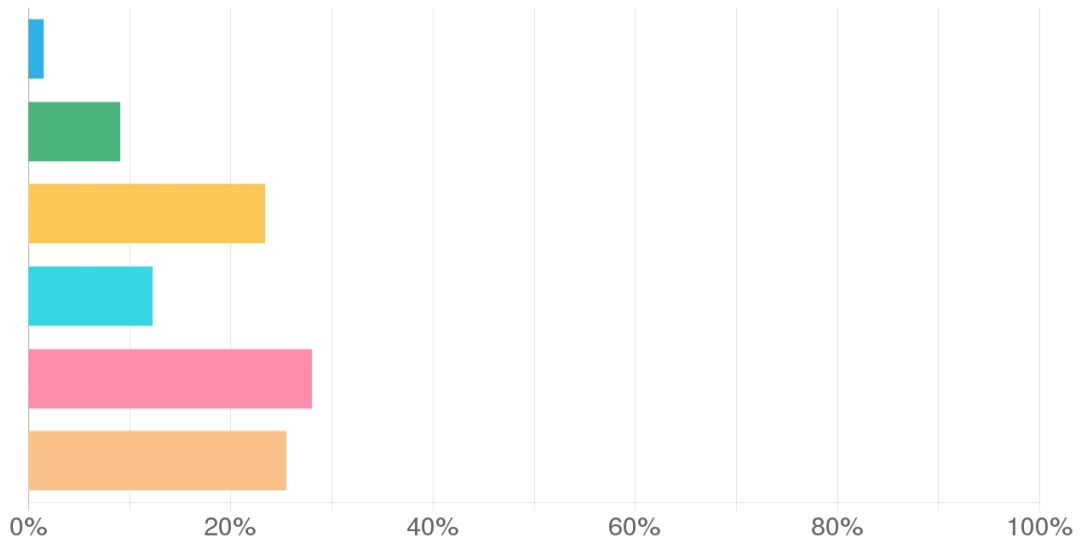

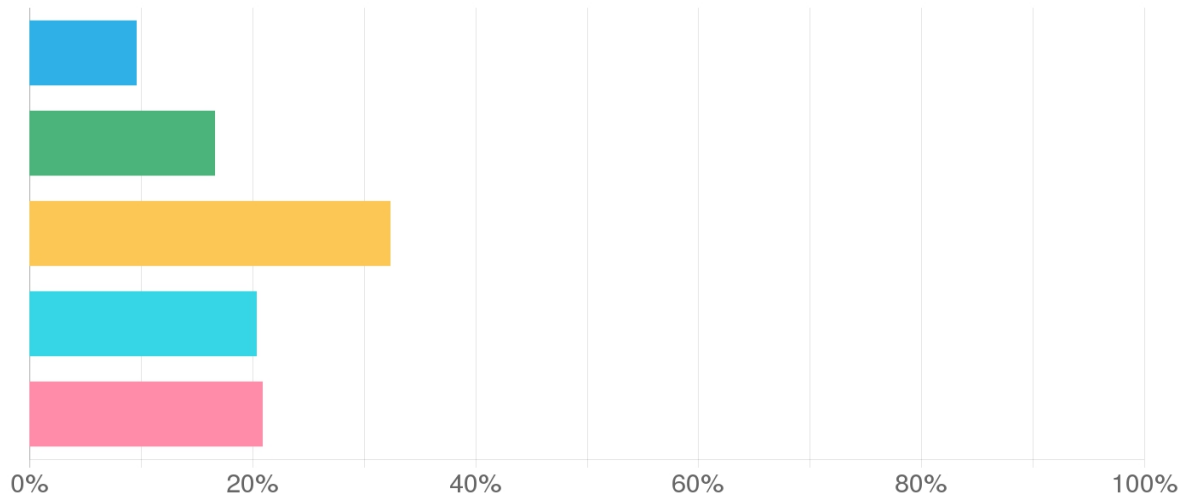

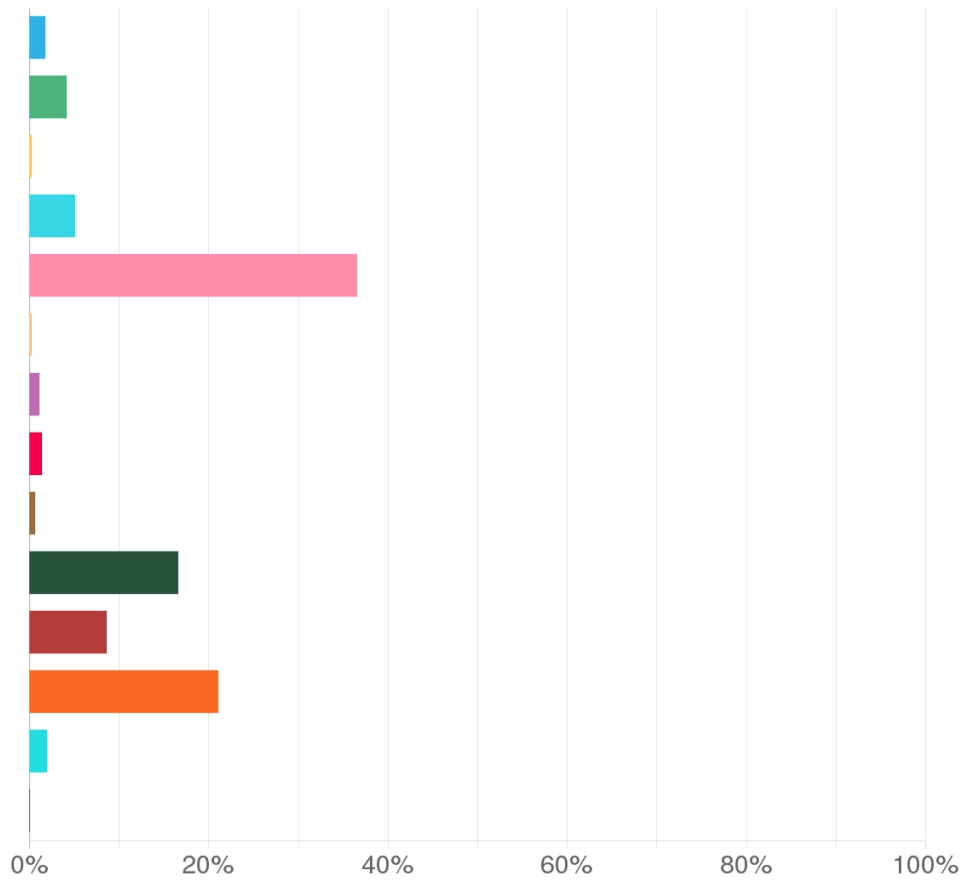

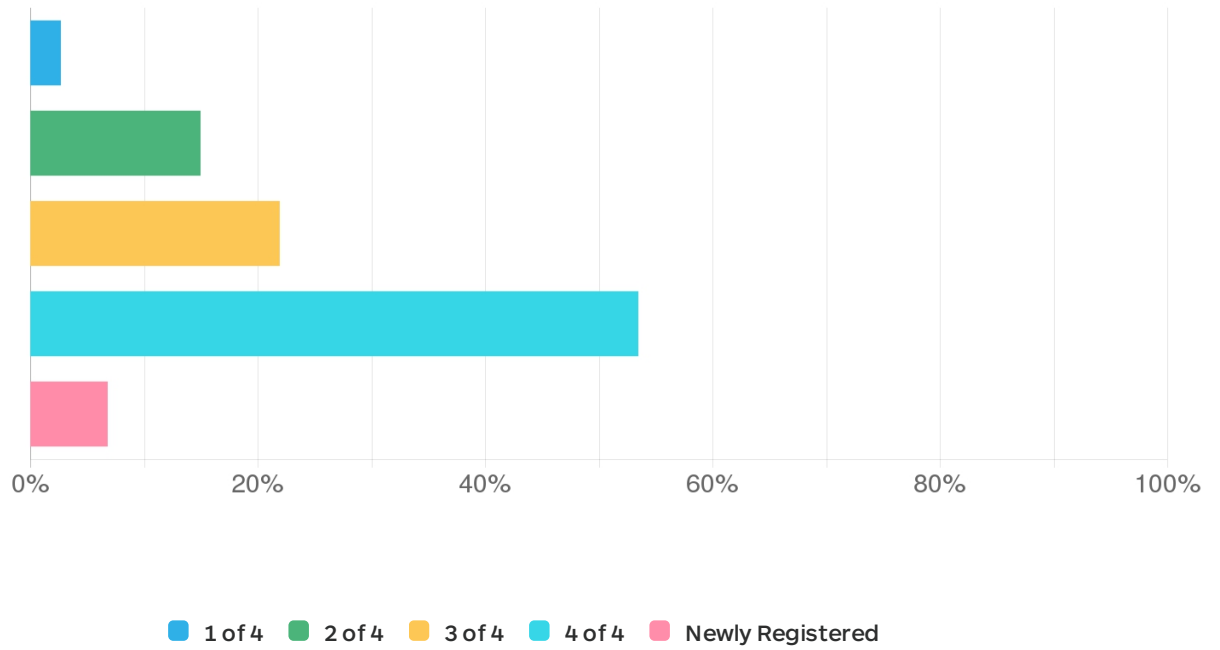
